While a long time casual photographer, Carla's more serious efforts as a photographer began in 2009 when she started a daily photo blog called Revealed Presence. She considered herself a photographer of ordinary things and her commitment with this daily blog, which continued thru 2014, was to post a photo every day, not that it had to be a great photo or one that was taken that day, and couple it with a thought-provoking question.

While still occasionally posting to this blog, in the past year her photographic interest has changed. After having been invited to exhibit as part of Sculpturefest at King Farm in Woodstock, Carla adopted a red chair found on the property and began to work in black and white, while pulling out the red color of the chair. And, for the first time began to include people in her images.

Carla has exhibited in multiple venues throughout the Upper Valley, including Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center, Northern Stage, Artistree Gallery, AVA Gallery, and the Norris Cotton Cancer Center. Her photographs are included in permanent collections at DHMC and Northern Stage as well as many individual collectors. Carla also teaches photography both to the general public and to people in difficult circumstances, most recently to a group of people with memory challenges and their care-partners at Dartmouth Hitchcock Aging Resource Center.
