

PRE-K THROUGH GRADE 5

ART DETECTIVES is a curriculum inspired art enrichment class that takes place at your school! It is an in-class field trip with all the magic and creativity that is the center of AVA's educational programs—acrylics, watercolors, collage, colored pencil and pastels—coming directly to your students!



Art Detectives introduces your students to artists, artistic styles and art movements. Making art history come alive through fun and creative activities, the students will feel not only like they've traveled to a museum for an afternoon but also to different lands and historical times! Students might visit the old west with Frederic Remington or Snap the Whip with Winslow Homer as they study early American History. Or perhaps they'll learn about van Gogh's Starry Starry Night and look up at their own night sky with a different perspective, or see the patterns, lines and shapes of mathematics in the masterpieces of Paul Klee or the science of color as Seurat saw it through a prism. Learning about and through visual art provides people of any age with the opportunity to experience different ways of seeing and thinking.



AVA'S Art Detectives class is designed to support and enhance classroom studies while developing art appreciation and literacy. A curricular theme, chosen by the teacher, serves as the inspiration for the choice of artwork and activities.

Art Detectives Class Structure:

- ▶ Class begins with a curriculum themed opening activity intended to draw the students into the moment.
- The opening activity leads into the presentation, study and discussion of the painting and artist. A simple history of both is presented and the subject matter and style of the painting—light, color, form, medium and space—is studied and discussed.
- ► The emphasis of the discussion leads to the art activity. Using any variety of art mediums, the students create their own works of art reflecting an aspect of the presented painting. Relaxed discussions continue through the completion of the art activity.
- ▶ The class concludes with students sharing their own masterpieces which will turn any classroom wall into a museum.

Program Particulars:

CLASS PREPARATION

The instructor will visit the teacher to discuss possible curriculum-based themes and confirm a date for the class.

LENGTH OF CLASS

Approximately 2 hours including clean-up.

MATERIALS

Art prints are provided by the instructor, and AVA will provide any materials not normally available at the program site.
